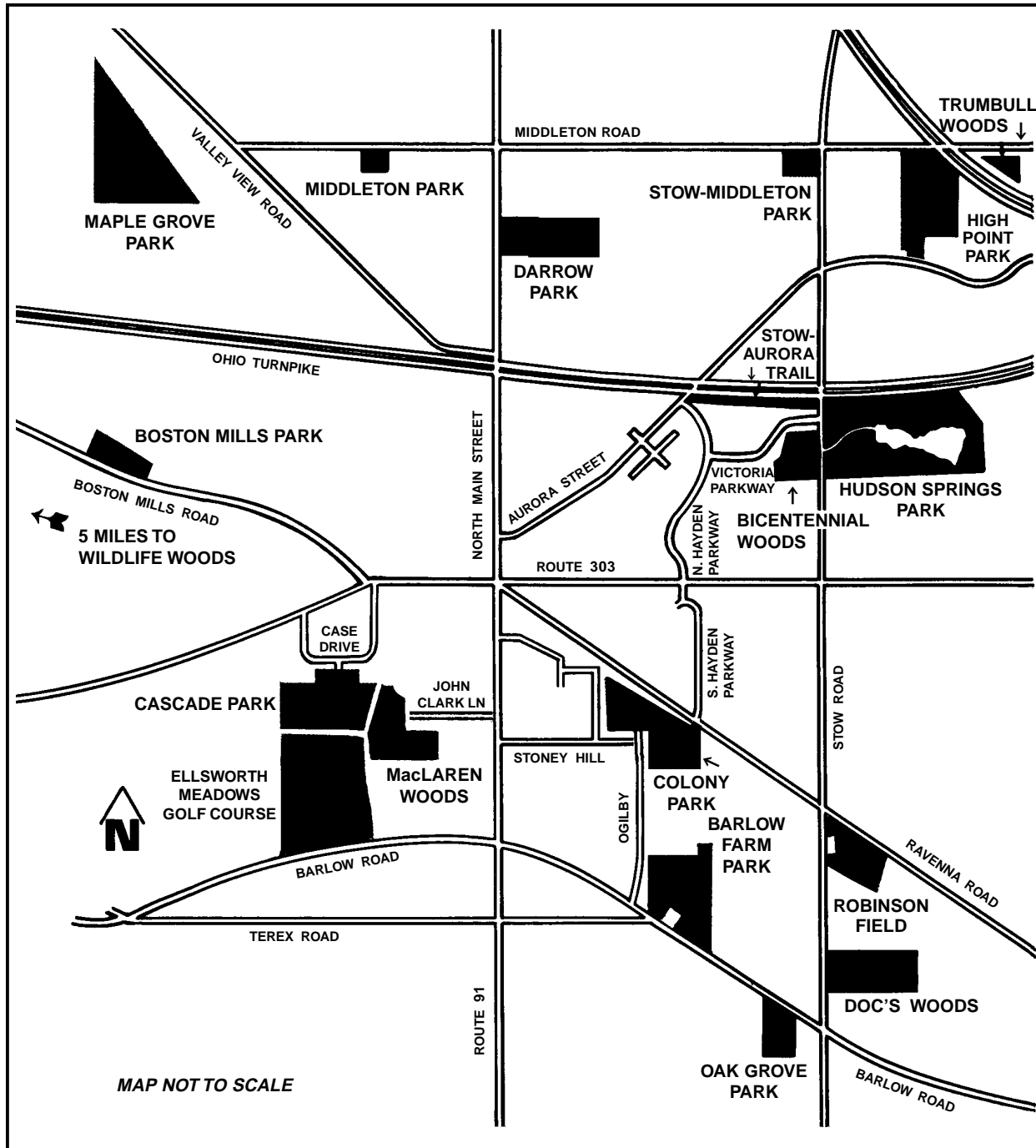

BARLOW FARM PARK

This 60-acre parcel on Barlow Road is a center of active recreation. The park boasts 6 soccer fields, 4 ball diamonds, multi purpose trail, pavilions, grills and play-ground equipment.

BICENTENNIAL WOODS PARK

This 33-acre parcel of heavily wooded land is one of the few remaining hardwood forest stands left in Hudson. It has a stream and is ideally located near the Hudson Schools’ central campus where it is used as a nature and environmental study area.

BOSTON MILLS PARK

About a mile northwest off Route 303, this eight acre park contains a quarter mile walking trail, providing an excellent vista for Lake Forest.

CASCADE PARK

This 75-acre neighborhood park is an open meadow and a wooded area. A stream with a falls flows through the park and into a natural peat bog. Three ball diamonds in the open area are heavily used by Little League groups. Located here are playground equipment and a trail.

COLONY PARK

With entrances off Ogilby Drive and at the intersection of South Hayden and Ravenna streets, the 34-acre neighborhood park is an open meadow usable for various recreational activities. Three ball diamonds accommodate Little League and Youth baseball. Playground equipment, a basketball court, and a pavilion are also available.

DARROW ROAD PARK

This 63-acre park has about 10 acres of mowed meadow, with parking off Route 91, and another 53 acres of hidden ponds, dense brush and wood lots reaching east.

DOC’S WOODS PARK

Located on the east side of Stow Road between Ravenna and Barlow Roads, this 59-acre parcel is a heavily wooded wetland.

ELLSWORTH MEADOWS GOLF COURSE AND ADJOINING PARCEL

Purchase of this 163-acre parcel was approved by Hudson Citizens in 1997. The golf course is now run by the city as its first municipal course and currently occupies @103 acres. Plans include expansion onto the adjoining 60-acre parcel.

HIGH POINT PARK

Located between Hudson Aurora Road and Middleton Road, these 52 acres of rolling meadow have great environmental value. Currently access is limited, but will eventually be from Middleton Road.

HUDSON SPRINGS PARK

Hudson’s 260 acre keystone park consists of a 50 acre lake, which provides excellent bass and bluegill fishing, a meadow, and woods. Wildlife, including ducks, geese, fox, deer, heron, owls and hawks, is frequently seen. Three picnic pavilions, two miles of trail around the lake, disc golf, volleyball, a playground, an open play meadow, and a children’s hedge maze are available. Walking trails supply access from surrounding neighborhoods.

MacLAREN WOODS PARK

This 27-acre wooded area is currently used as a nature and wildlife preserve. It contains a substantial stand of large conifers, which serves as a nesting site for birds.

MAPLE GROVE PARK

This 100-acre parcel is a mix of field, forest and wetlands, rich in wildlife, with strong environmental value.

MIDDLETON PARK

This eight-acre neighborhood park consists primarily of an open meadow with a wooded creek area. Additionally, it has a pavilion, one small ball diamond and a basketball court.

OAK GROVE PARK

This 30-acre park has a lighted softball field, a playground and grills, two Little League fields and a pavilion. The Jaycees use the park in the fall for their Haunted House.

ROBINSON FIELD PARK

Located at the southeast corner of Stow and Ravenna, this 31-acre field has recreational potential.

STOW-AURORA TRAIL

This ten-acre narrow strip, one and a half miles long, lies south of the Ohio Turnpike between Stow and Hudson Aurora roads.

STOW MIDDLETON PARK

This 17-acre meadow has a ball diamond, a pavilion, playground equipment, soccer fields and two sand volleyball courts.

TRUMBULL WOODS PARK

This 18-acre natural preserve is a wealth of diverse ecological areas, including a stream, a swamp, a meadow, beech-maple woods, and an arboretum. A hiking trail winds throughout the park.

WILDLIFE WOODS

This completely wooded 58-acre razorback hill is surrounded by the Cuyahoga Valley National Recreation Area. It is in close proximity to the Buckeye Trail and serves as a game preserve and wildlife area.
