Start



Start your adventure at **Open Door Coffee** (164 N. Main Street). In addition to fresh-roasted fair trade coffee, you will find delicious treats baked in-house! Head north, peeking in the windows of **The Learned Owl Book Shop** and checking

to see if anyone is recording a podcast in **PodPopuli** on the corner of Owen Brown Street (named for John Brown's father).

Keep Going

Cross to the east side of Main Street at the crosswalk. Head north, turn right on Chapel Street. Check out the **Old Hudson Township Burying Ground** (find David Hudson's grave). Turn right on College, enjoying Western Reserve Academy's **Brick Row**, ending at the second-oldest Observatory in the country. Left on Aurora Street to Oviatt, turn right. Watch for the 19th century **hitching post**. Cross 303 and continue south past Barlow Community Center.



Steps so far: 2,508

A walk around the two ponds on your left will add 1500 steps if you do it in one large circle.

Steps so far: 4,008

Almost There

Cross to the Police Station and take the path on the left past the station, check out the **Lincoln Plaque**, and continue on behind the historic Turners Mill building, which now houses **Rosewood Grill**.

Cross 303 and stop for a photo op at the Gazebo before re-fueling with a bite to eat or a DORA drink at **Hudson's Restaurant, Kepners** or **Farmers Rail**.

Total steps: 5,040
